Mitsubishi Electric Donates 1 Million Baht to Support "Light of Heart Field Hospital" for COVID-19 Patients

The new field hospital will receive green and yellow COVID-19 patients to help mitigate the shortage of hospital beds and healthcare resources which is almost stretched to capacity. It also provides improved access to care and helps to shine the light of hope and happiness in braving the COVID-19 storm in Thailand.
