This activity is one of the collaborations under the "Community Forest Partnership for Climate Action Project" by the Mitsubishi Electric Thai Foundation, Mitsubishi Electric Group in Thailand together with The Royal Forest Department, Thailand Greenhouse Gas Management Organization, and Ban Thai Community Forest.

This year, an additional 30 rais (12 acres) of community forest is being replanted with native plants of ecological and economic importance such Tabaek, Salao, Bamboo, Sadao, Keelek, Makham Pom, Pega and Smor. To make this forest green, a joint physically demanding effort is asked of all the volunteers and local inhabitants who are willing to contribute.

It is expected that this rewilding activity can capture 16.2 tons of carbon dioxide equivalent per year, so in 10-years time, 162 tons carbon dioxide equivalent (CO2e).

This is one of the latest concrete positive effects resulting from joint collaboration with our stakeholders of both government and private sector with local community. Not only does this reflect our vision to increase green areas, but our commitment to instill environmental awareness to our employees as part of our valuable asset. by participating in this sustainable social responsibility event.
